
### QUILEUTE ANNUAL FISHING REGULATION OFF RESERVATION


**April 28, 2017**

<b>FISHERY:</b>	Restricted Commercial Fisheries
<b>TARGET SPECIES:</b>	Halibut
<b>MANAGEMENT PERIOD:</b>	March 11, 2017 noon – November 7, 2017 noon
<b>MANAGEMENT AREA:</b>	Cape Alava 48° 10' 00" N to Queets River 47° 31' 42" N Western boundary: 125° 44' 00" W. longitude.
<b>SEASON:</b>	<b>Opens: May 1, 2017 8:00 am</b> <b>Closes: May 2, 2017 7:00 pm</b>
<b>GEAR RESTRICTIONS:</b>	Longline Gear
<b>OTHER RESTRICTIONS:</b>	<b>2011 Management Measures as per court order</b>
<b>ALLOCATION:</b>	500 pound landing limit/calendar day, TAC 82,821 lbs.
<b>ASSESSMENT MEETINGS:</b>	Tribal conference calls: <b>TBD</b>

**SUBSISTENCE:** During the commercial management period from March 11, 2017 until the end of this period, there is a four legal sized halibut per vessel per day limit restriction. You must report all Subsistence take home on fish tickets. During all non-commercial management periods Subsistence is open year round, (two halibut per person/per day).

**NOTE:** This regulation supersedes all previous postings. Operators participating in the halibut fishery shall maintain an accurate log book (Provided by IPHC). Recording of halibut fishing operations is in compliance with federal regulations.
