QUILEUTE ANNUAL FISHING REGULATION OFF RESERVATION 2019

FISHERY: Commercial, Ceremonial & Subsistence

TARGET SPECIES: **GROUND FISH** (widow rockfish, Pacific Ocean perch (POP), thornyheads, yellowtail, bocaccio, canary rockfish, and all other rockfish species)

MANAGEMENT PERIOD: January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019.

MANAGEMENT AREA: Cape Alava 48 10' 00" N to
Queets River 47 31' 42" N

OPENS: January 1, 2019 @ 12:00 Noon
CLOSES: December 31, 2019 @ 11:59 p.m.

LEGAL GEAR: Non-trawl gear

LANDING RESTRICTIONS AND HARVEST GUIDELINES:


- **Lingcod.** 600 Lbs. daily trip limit, 1800 Lbs./wk. round weight (22 inches or 18 inches dressed)
- **Thornyheads.** 300 Lbs. daily trip limit for long and short spine combined.
- **Canary Rockfish.** 300 Lbs. daily trip limit
- **Yelloweye Rockfish.** 100 Lbs. daily trip limit.
- **Black Rockfish.** Unlimited, except 10,000 pounds tribal quota between Destruction Island and Leadbetter Point.
- **Dover Sole** – 5,000 pounds/month
- **Widow Rockfish** – 300 pounds /trip. Landing of Widow rockfish must not exceed 10% of the weight of yellowtail for a two month period.
- **Yellow Tail Rockfish** – 300 pounds/trip.
- **Pacific Ocean Perch** – 1,800 pounds/2 month time period.
- **Minor Slope**-300 pounds/ trip.
- **Minor Nearshore** – 300 pounds/ trip
- **Minor Shelf** – 300 pounds/trip.

Note: Rockfish taken during open competition commercial tribal fisheries for Pacific halibut or sablefish will not be subject to trip limits.

Note: This regulation supersedes all previous regulations.

Full Retention-There is a full retention requirement of all overfished rockfish species as well as all other marketable rockfishes caught during a tribal fishery.
