THIS MATTER having come before the Court *sua sponte* this 18th day of November, 2022 to set forth court dates and dockets, and the Court being fully informed finds as follows:

FINDINGS

The Quileute Tribal Council recently approved a new Quileute Tribal Court schedule and Court dockets. There is good cause to implement the following:

ORDER

- The court shall schedule three court dates each month. The second court date of each
 month shall be held via video platform (Zoom and/or other platform as directed by the
 Court Administrator).
- 2. Effective January 1, 2023, the court shall set hearings and other court proceedings as follows:

A. Indian Child Welfare and Civil Hearings

- i. Scheduled on the first Tuesday of each month beginning at 11:00 a.m.
- ii. Hearings shall be held in-person at the Quileute Tribal Court.
- iii. Hearing Types: all ICW and other civil matters as directed by the Chief Judge.

B. Criminal, Civil, and Healing-to-Wellness Court Hearings

i. Scheduled on the second Tuesday of each month beginning at 11:00 a.m.

ii. Hearings will be a hybrid of in-person and via video platform. Hearings shall be held in-person for all defendants and Wellness Court participants, and via video platform for Court personnel (*not* including the Court Clerk). iii. Hearing Types: bail review, arraignment, pre-trial (unless a change of plea is anticipated), probation status review, and special set criminal or civil matters.

C. Criminal, Civil, and Healing-to-Wellness Court Hearings

- i. Scheduled on the fourth Tuesday of each month beginning at 11:00 a.m.
- ii. Hearings shall be held in person at the Quileute Tribal Court.
- iii. Hearing Types: bail review, trial readiness, motion hearing, sentencing, probation status review, warrant quash, protection order petitions, and special set criminal and civil matters.

D. Requests to Appear Via Video Platform

- i. The Court may allow a party to appear via video platform on a case-by-case basis. All requests for video appearances must be in writing and filed with the Court at least three days prior to the scheduled hearing. A decision will be made by the Court whether to grant the request for video appearance at least 24 hours prior to the scheduled hearing.
- ii. All persons who have been granted permission to appear virtually are responsible for providing their correct contact information, including phone number and email address to the Court Clerk *prior to the hearing*. The Court Clerk's office will not be responsible for incomplete or incorrect contact information.
- 3. This Order shall remain in full force and effect until rescinded by the Court.
